The PORT Shelter Program assists the homeless in our area from November to March.

Various churches volunteer to "host" the program and use their buildings for a week at a time so the homeless can be fed and housed for the evening. The number of guests each night is about 70 to 125. Strict guidelines regulate whether the guests may stay or not.

"Partnership churches" assist the host churches in completing this program. St. Luke's has agreed again this year to partner and this means we have obligations to perform. We provide volunteers to

help with shelter duties and meet the needs of our guests.

We provide:

- ~ (4-6) volunteers for check-in processing
- ~ (6 plus) volunteers for dinner meal and serving (same group provides food for breakfast next morning)
- ~ (2 plus) volunteers to serve breakfast and help clean up facility before leaving (guests must leave facility by 7 am each day)
- ~ (4-6) volunteers for overnight duty (rotating shifts allows for sleep) (same group provides check-out processing in the morning)
- ~ St. Luke's provides all

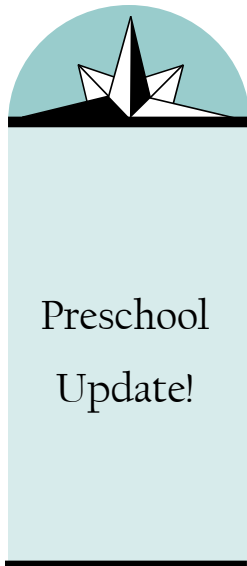

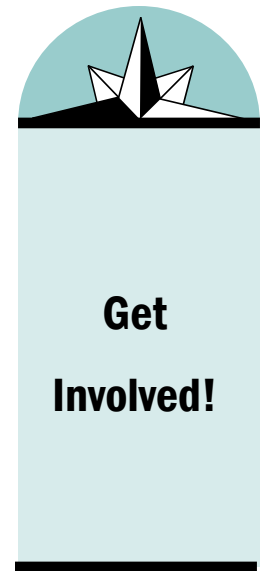

## Advent Manger Project: Something We Can All Support

Each Sunday of Advent, this project invites the children's Sunday school classes, parents, and congregation to prepare for the birth of Jesus through crafts, prayer, and mission giving. Each week we focus on a theme of preparation for the

birth of Jesus. Four ministries will be represented by these four themes. They are:

- ◆ Manger-The Humble Place, Uganda, East Africa
- ◆ Hay-The Goat Project, Nepal, Central Asia
- ◆ Blanket-UMCOR, Disaster Response, United States and Worldwide
- ◆ Baby Jesus-The John Wesley School for Persons with Disabling Conditions, Santiago, Chile

St. Luke's Children will prepare a display in the narthex. A Christmas

## A Musing Mark

Here is something to keep in mind for the next few weeks:

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But

the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest heaven,  
and on earth peace  
among those whom he favors!"

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds

returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

Let us start each day this season with this story. Remembering the greatest gift ever given is not a bad way to start the day. Know that God loves you. Share that love with someone else each day. And by Christmas, we'll let us see how we feel. I pray that you will have a wonderful Advent season and a Merry Christmas.

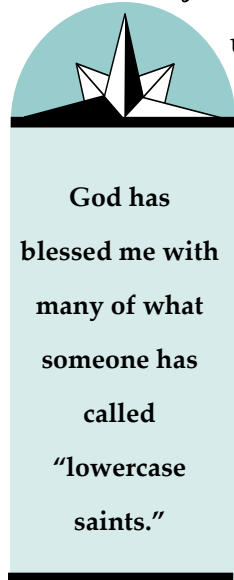

## Pastor Bill's Back Page

I confess. When I was growing up, we never observed Advent. To my knowledge, we had never even heard of it. I'll wager that we wouldn't have known what it was if we had. There were no advent colors of purple or blue. There was no advent wreath, and no advent candles. There were few advent hymns in the hymnal. We didn't know how to sing the ones that were there.

Nope. Instead, we just hopped right into the "holiday season" on the fourth Thursday in November. Sated with turkey, gravy, and cranberry sauce, we waddled into Christmas." At least that's what the commercials called it. That high and holy season began with the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade and ended with a visit from Santa Claus. In the days between, we tried to cram pageants, plays, and special projects. We wrote letters to Santa, full of wishing, hoping, and, sometimes, pleading. We tried to ease up on the "naughty" and give the "nice" full rein. It was a season populated with the frenetic energy of boys and girls counting down the time



until that special night. When Christmas Day arrived, we were absolutely exhausted and ready to be rid of the entire enterprise.

I didn't discover Advent until I left home. I was intrigued immediately. For one thing, Advent was so... counter-cultural. With frequently sappy sentimentality, the

world around me rushed headlong into celebrating the birth of baby Jesus. Advent, on the other hand, realistically and soberly counseled patient preparation for the return of an adult Christ. Beginning sometime in October, if not sooner, the stores and malls featured recordings of carols both sacred and secular. Advent's hymns and carols struck a distinctly different note as they sang of Christ's coming to finish his Easter work. The world as I had known it took its cues from human efforts, mostly those of buying and selling. Advent arose from the church's intention to focus her life and ministry around the life and ministry of Christ.

Years later, the themes of Advent still intrigue me. If you ask me, this season's rich imagery, music, and message are more counter-cultural than ever. Yet, I am convinced that

they are the very things that our world most needs. In the face of deep-seated hatred and ongoing strife, our world desperately longs for mercy and justice, peace and renewal. Our world longs for salvation, healing, and life. In ways both subtle and bold, Advent proclaims, sings of, and prays for the One who can bring these things to fruition.

And something else, too. Since the risen Christ promised to return, Advent urges us to be awake, aware, and alert for his coming. Since we don't know when that day will occur, we are to be ready whenever it happens. How do we get ready? We join the faithful in worship. We offer our prayers for others. We immerse ourselves in God's Word. We remember our baptism and share in the Lord's Supper. We serve the poor and needy. It is in doing this that we stand vigil for Christ's coming. We prepare a place for Christ. We greet the living Christ who is, and was, and is to come.
