As a means of recognizing their service to St. Luke's, we asked them to write a personal letter to St. Luke's. We have received three letters.

Greeting to the family of God gathered at St. Luke's United Methodist Church,

I am sorry to decline your offer to participate in your worship service to celebrate 50 years of women ordained in full connection in the United Methodist Church. I had other commitments that would not allow me to be there with you. I would very much like to see old friends and celebrate our time together while I was your Associate Minister (1994-97). I am thankful for the three years of ministry with you, together with Senior Pastor Rev. Tom Sweat. I fondly remember those years and feel that St. Luke's, my family, and I benefited greatly from those years spent in ministry together.

My family has grown since I was with you. Many of you know that in September 27, 2003, Birt Cory and I were married. God worked miraculously to bring us together with the help of E-harmony. Birt is now a part time licensed local pastor at Indiana United Methodist Church and a full time seminary student at Virginia Union University School of Theology in Richmond, Virginia. He should graduate with a Masters of Divinity degree in May 2007 and be available for full time

appointment in July. He has one son, Alex, who is 20 years old. Alex has just graduated from ECPI and looking for a job in computer programming.

Steven is now 17 years old and a rising senior at Stone Bridge Christian School in Chesapeake. His passion is serving the Lord and playing baseball. He recently returned from a "Voices of Youth" mission trip to Zimbabwe, Mozambique, and South Africa. He is president of our UMY Fellowship and also president of the Portsmouth District Youth. He plays guitar and drums and leads our Praise Team at St. Andrew's UMC. He plans to go to college in the fall, but is not sure where at this time.

Joshua joined the Army when he graduated from high school. He has completed his 6 year enlistment and is now employed as a Diesel Mechanic, which is the trade he learned while in the Army. He is married to Sara and they are expecting their first child in January. So I am happily anticipating being a "grandma."

This is my sixth year as pastor at St. Andrew's UMC. This is a wonderful church family and we are active in many ministries and missions. Keep us in your prayers as we seek to share the gospel of Jesus Christ here in this community. This year is really exciting for me. I am taking a class in connection with Duke Divinity School and the Creative Center for Leadership. We will meet four times in the next year with 24 other pastors from Virginia, North and South Carolina to examine and challenge our leadership styles. There is lots of reading. And best of all, I will be assigned a personal coach to hold me accountable to put what I am learning into use at my local church. 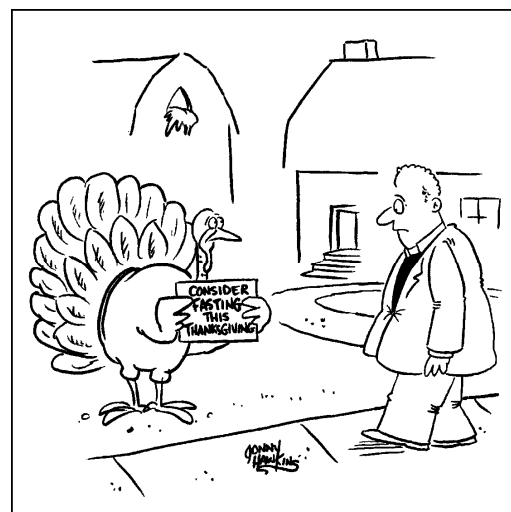
Clara's Quips
