Consecration Sunday emphasizes our personal stewardship as a matter of our

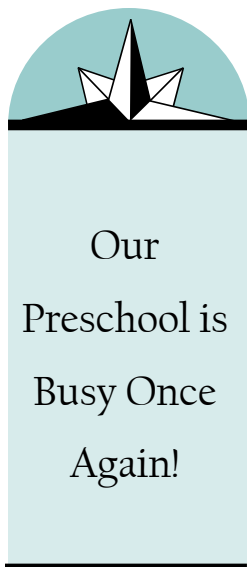
commitment to God and to St. Luke's. Quite simply, the effectiveness of our mission and ministries depends on our initiative and dedication.

In one weeks time, we collected,

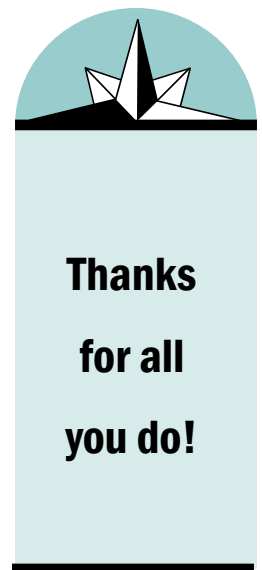
- \* 141 health kits

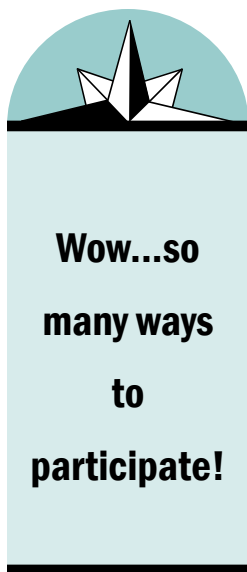
## Making Disciples....

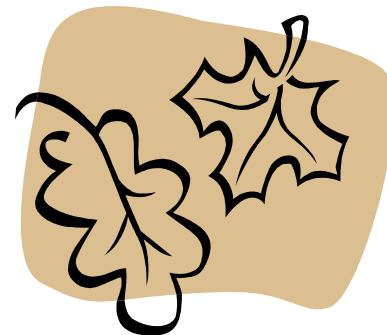
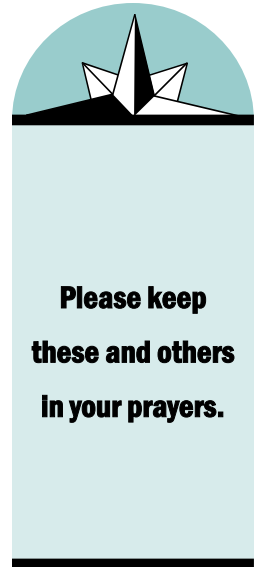

## A Musing Mark

I don't know what I was thinking. Perhaps it was temporary insanity or the love of my family or just some hopeful part of me that said lets give it another try, I am not sure. Yet we did it, we got a dog. You may remember my writing about having to get rid of the one we had before because it was not a good fit with us. That was very hard to do. Yet here I am bringing another animal into the house.

This dog is a puppy about four months old. She is a mix of Golden Retriever and Australian Sheppard. My wife found her in a search online. She was at a shelter north of Fredericksburg and we picked her up on our way home from vacation in August. To my great relief, things are going rather well. I have found myself comparing this dog (named Zora) to our last dog (Takoda.) She is so much better behaved. We have had hardly any "accidents" in the house and those have come about when I did not listen to her wanting to get outside. She lets herself be brushed and have her claws trimmed without a fight. What is the difference?

The other day I began to reflect on what I knew of the two dog's backgrounds. Takoda was older and had been living on the street for

an undetermined amount of time. He had not been socialized and taken care of in many ways which left him to develop his own understanding of what he needed to do to survive. Our new dog Zora was taken from her mom at about 6 weeks old. She was cared for in a shelter from then on till we picked her up. She has had loving caring people in her life who have nurtured her along. I can see the difference in the way our new dog acts as compared to how the other one did.

Now I understand that there are differences in breeds and that makes a big difference in how they act. But I can't help but think that the nurture they did or did not receive made a big difference as well. I think that this is very true about humans.

Some people are raised in good homes and have good opportunities placed before them. Some people are raised in less fortunate circumstances and have to "learn a different set of rules to live by." The real problem in our relationships comes in the fact that we don't understand or consider our circumstances compared to others. I remember one of my classmates in seminary telling a woman at the hospital that she had to make certain

priorities for her child's treatments. She had to go into her boss and tell them that she needed off every morning to take her child to treatments. Well he had come from a nice corporate job where he could do that. The woman was not in that kind of job and if she demanded the time like he told her, they would have fired her and there goes the medical insurance to pay for the treatments in the first place. It wasn't that my friend was heartless; he just did not understand the circumstances in which she lived.

I believe that is what God wants from us when he talks about humility. We need to try and understand someone else before we rush to make a decision about them. "There but for the grace of God go I", means thanking God for the gifts and opportunities that we have been given. It also means recognizing the responsibility that we have to give opportunities to others in need. Thank God for all we truly have been given and let us make possible opportunities for others by being good stewards of what we have been given.

## Pastor Bill's Back Page

It is written, "The race is not to the swift, nor the battle to the strong, nor bread to the wise, nor riches to the intelligent, nor favor to the skillful; but time and chance happen to them all." (*Ecclesiastes 9:11, NRSV*) Time and chance. I find myself thinking especially about these two things this month. This is October, after all, the month in which I was born. On the fifth of this month, I'll observe (celebrate?) my fiftieth birthday. Of course, what this really means is that I'll enter my fifty-first year of life this month. (A so-called "good friend" pointed out this sobering fact to me.) Ouch! *Tempus fugit*. Life happens. Time and chance.

It seems to me that there's something about my half century mark that calls for a bit of nostalgia as well as some earnest anticipation. More and more, I find myself hearkening back to "the good ol' days." That's how I'm tempted to see them anyway. When I am honest, however, I realize that the past five decades have been a combination of both light and shadow. There have certainly been many good and golden moments. Truth is, though, there have been quite a few devastating

tragedies, too. I realize that I am far from alone in this. Apparently, the fabric of life is just woven this way.

I also find myself eagerly awaiting the future. A bit of Jewish wisdom says that God created human beings because God loves stories. Isn't that wonderful? How will my story turn out, I wonder? What new characters will be introduced? What old characters will reappear? How will the plot evolve and advance? How many chapters will there finally be?

Once, in a monastic retreat setting, a brother in Christ guided us through a meditation on our life and death. At its conclusion, each of us was permitted to consider the circumstances and setting of our last day. We imagined who was with us and how old we were, among other things. When we debriefed the exercise, I shared that, since I was allowed to determine my age at death, I chose a hundred and thirty-seven! I mean, why not?! It's as good a number as any. I also shared that I felt like an infant being handed from one set of loving arms

to another. Hmm, thinking about it now, that meditation was one of my life's good and golden moments.

"Time and chance happen to them all." To all of us. Light and shadow. Good and ill. Triumph and tragedy. Such is the stuff of our life. I am convinced, however, that underlying all of it are the everlasting arms of God.

I am also convinced that, whatever our age, whatever our story, the Westminster Shorter Catechism of the Reformed Tradition is correct about our purpose and meaning in life. "The chief end of man is to glorify God and enjoy him forever." May you live your days, years, and decades in the glory and the joy of the Lord. May your story be long and full. And may it be a pleasant read for the Author of Souls.
